The **Government Law Admission Program (GLAP)** is designed to **expand access to justice** by increasing the number of lawyers serving in public sector roles.

Arizona is facing a shortage of government lawyers, and we are taking action! GLAP provides a potential pathway for attorneys from **non-reciprocal jurisdictions** to practice law in Arizona. If you are looking to make a meaningful impact in government law, this is your opportunity!

GLAP officially launches on April 14, 2025, when applications will become available.

Are You Eligible?

To qualify for a GLAP license, applicants must:

Be admitted by bar examination in a U.S. state or territory that does not offer Arizona lawyers admission on motion.

- Hold a Juris Doctor from an ABA-accredited law school.
- Have a **passing MPRE score**.
- Be in **good standing** in all jurisdictions where admitted.
- Vot currently subject to any **disciplinary actions** and none pending.
- Meet Arizona's character and fitness requirements.
- Complete the Arizona law course as required by Supreme Court Rule 34(j).

Provide an **affidavit** from an Arizona government law office confirming employment upon licensure.

Commit to five years of service in a government law office.

Your Future in Arizona Law

GLAP licensees will work **exclusively** in government law offices for five years. After completing the program and meeting all requirements, participants will gain **regular admission to practice law in Arizona** under Rule 34(f).
